
I am the number 100, and 40 is my best friend. We are just about to leave for a two-week summer camp with a group of whole numbers. We are all students at the same school.







Do you see me? I am looking out of the back window of the bus, and I am waving goodbye with my handkerchief. My friend is beside me.









We have arrived. We are all busy pitching camp. Some other numbers are helping 40 to fetch some logs. I am working on the cooking team.






























We are visiting a castle on the top of a hill. 40 is a long way behind me and is complaining about the road being rocky and about sore feet.




Today is Sunday. I am singing in the church choir along with 40 and a lot of other numbers. It's not easy to find out where we are in the picture because we look so much alike.







